Course Overview

LPGA Level II Video course will review the 12 components of the LPGA Lesson Model. Example lessons, technical tips, and feedback on meeting the grading expectations will be covered.

Upon Completion of LPGA Level II Video Course, the student will:

Identify the 12 components of the LPGA Lesson Model and demonstrate these requirements in both a short game and full swing lesson.

A minimum score of 6 out of 12 points in Communication and 6 out of 12 points in Application is required to pass.

Required Text

Required technology access:

<u>Internet:</u> Participants will need internet access to login to the Google Classroom online course.

Dual Microphone set: specs and details about where to purchase are in the course (approx. cost \$100)

<u>Web browsers for computers:</u> Students should use google chrome when accessing the course for best system results.

<u>App:</u> Access grades, course content, and more from the Google app on your mobile device. Available on iOS and Android.



<u>Video recording device</u>: Students will need to have access to a video recording device (smart phone or camcorder to record videos of themselves and/or golf swings. The device must also capture sound. Depending on the device students may need microphones or wireless earbuds that have a microphone.

Assignments

This course has 8 required assignments – 1 quiz, 2 getting started assignments, 1 practice video submission, 1 full-swing video submission with forms, 1 full-swing feedback conversation and written questions to answer, 1 short game video submission with forms, 1 short game feedback conversation and written questions to answer. All assignments must be submitted on time to receive credit for the course.

Submission guidelines

All videos must adhere to the filming and submission guidelines to be accepted. All videos submitted for both the practice assignment and the final video submission must be original and not ones submitted for previous assignments. All videos that do not meet the guidelines will be returned to students and a \$50 charge, per video, to resubmit will be assessed. Resubmitted videos must be uploaded to the assignment within 7 days. If a video is not resubmitted within 7 days the student will be removed from the class and must register for another semester. If removed from the class, the student is not responsible for the \$50 resubmission fee, per video, but will lose 50% of the course registration fee and will be responsible for the full registration fee of the next semester they register for. Feedback Phone calls

Feedback phone calls must be completed within the assigned 2 weeks. The evaluator who grades your videos will send you an email with available dates and times. Please respond to that email within 48 hours to schedule the call.

All calls will be conducted using Zoom. You will need to either use a smart phone with a camera or a computer with a camera.

Academic Integrity

Students are expected to complete their own work. Video submissions that appear to be scripted or edited to meet the time requirements will not be accepted and the student will receive an incomplete for the assignment.

Late Assignments

Lesson video assignments are due by 11:59 PM EDT on the assigned due date. Late submissions will not be accepted. Any student who does not submit the Lesson video requirements will receive an incomplete for the course and must register to take the course another semester.

Grades

Feedback will be in the gradebook within 2 weeks of the assignment deadline date.

Your videos will be graded by one evaluator.

The evaluator will provide you with the grading forms with the points and feedback.

A minimum score of 6 out of 12 points in Communication and 6 out of 12 points in Application is required to pass.

A passing score at Level III is 10 out of 12 in each category.

Live Calls

All students are required to attend the Live calls. Notify LPGA Headquarters ahead of time if you are unable to attend. Acceptable reasons for makeup exams include severe illness, family emergency or other unavoidable events. All Live calls will be recorded and posted to the LIVE Call Folder. All students are required to complete the LIVE Call Knowledge Check Assignment.

Cancellations

All cancellations must be received in writing via email or facsimile by LPGA Headquarters prior to the semester program start date. Cancellations received 3 weeks or less from the program start date will incur a \$50 cancellation fee. No-shows will incur a 100% forfeiture of the total registration fee (\$400).

If a student starts the class and cancels during the semester, they will incur a \$150 cancellation fee and must notify LPGA Headquarters in writing via email. The student must retake the course but will be exempt from any assignments already completed if the next course is within 2 calendar years of the canceled course. Retakes after the 2 calendar years must pay the full price of the program and complete all assignments.

If a student has extenuating circumstances (medical or bereavement) that do not allow them to complete the course or attend the in-person portion of the course, the student MUST notify LPGA Headquarters in writing stating the reason and any doctors' notes or accompanying documents. Those with approved extenuating circumstances will be moved to the next semester. A \$50 transfer fee applies.
